

Basic Scout Weekend Camping List

- Medical forms and insurance card copies***
- RX Medicines, Epipen - clearly marked with dosage***

Camping Equipment

- Small tent with waterproof ground cloth***
- Extra tarp for over tent if rain predicted
- Sleeping bag, pillow* (*weather rated*)**
- Sleeping pad***
- Small battery powered lantern (Non-fueled)
- Camping chair

Clothes

- Wear class A's for carpools***
- Class B Troop 1818 T-shirt (if you have one)***
- Change of clothes (extra clothes, socks, shoes, underwear)
- GOOD Rain gear, poncho or raincoat***
- Jacket/Hoodie (layers)
- Sleeping clothes
- Durable closed toe walking shoes. NO CROCS***
- Hat or ball cap
- Dirty clothes bag

Toilet Kit

- Toothpaste, toothbrush, comb
- Deoderant***
- Camping towel
- Small body wash/small shampoo
- Bug spray and suntan lotion for a couple of days.

Back Pack Essentials*

- Light day/hiking backpack (*NO string straps*)**
- Whistle**
- Water bottle or hydration bladder (1+ liters)**
- Small first aid kit**
- Small flashlight or headlamp**
- Sun screen & bug spray (*travel size, NO aerosols*)**
- Pocket knife *with Totin' Chip*
- Compass and map**
- Adult cell#/contact phone number on Scout**
- Hand sanitizer
- Extra pair of dry socks

Meal Supplies

- Hot mug/cup for hot chocolate***
- Mess kit or plate, bowl, eating utensils***
- Small mesh dryer bag**

Optional

- Ear plugs if scout has sensory issues. (the Scout Master snores loudly)
- Cash for trading post
- Scout handbook
- Hot hands/ hand warmers/ gloves
- Extra batteries, bulbs for lanterns, flashlights
- Sunglasses
- Notebook and pencil
- Cards, travel chess or games for downtime

***Items in bold and blue are REQUIRED!
Scouts will be uncomfortable without the rest,
but they will survive.**

DO NOT pack food unless instructed otherwise.

**No electronics, mobile phones or smart watches
without Scout Master permission. Parent and
scout must sign Electronics Agreement and give
to leadership.**

DO NOT count on electricity to be available.

Scouts may use a single medium duffel bag for car camping trips. Try to fit as much as you can into these. Carpooling space is limited. A 55+ liter backpack will be needed for overnight hiking camping.
